- **INNOCULATION**

Surgeon John Harris of Experiment Farm led the programme in 1800 to protect children from deadly smallpox. World Health Organisation said disease stopped in 1970s.

- **FINE QUALITY WOOL**

Elizabeth and John Macarthur bred merino sheep for quality wool creating successful Australian export industry.



- **FIRST DISTANCE FLIGHT BY AIRCRAFT**

William Hart flew from Penrith to land in Parramatta Park in 1913.



- **FEMALE FACTORY SANCTUARY**

work place, health care and accommodation built by Governor Lachlan Macquarie in 1818.
