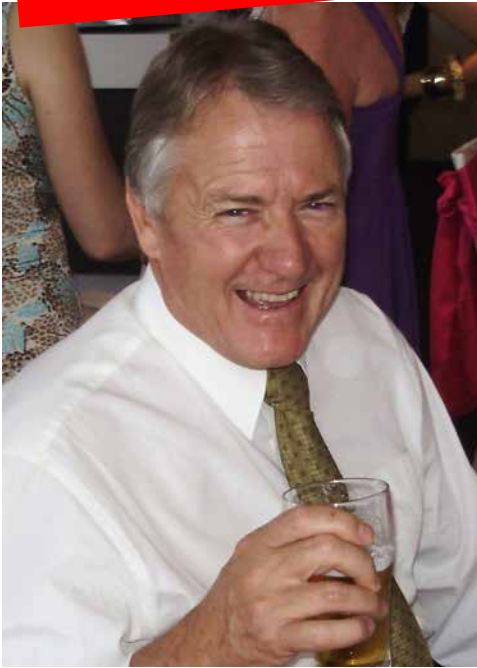

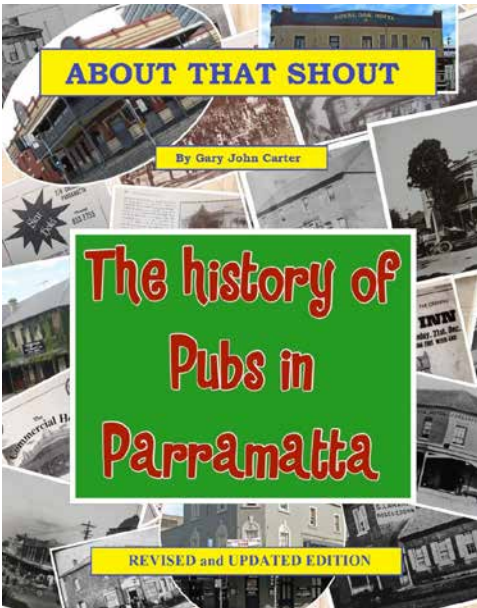
The book contains an account of past and present hotels and inns of Parramatta dating from 1800 to the present 2018. It is compiled from written history, web related sources, reference material and accounts.

He was the PR Manager for a hotel school in the Blue Mountains where he lives with his wife and two children. He has written two novels, Palace of Tears and The Opal Dragonfly, the latter set in Elizabeth Bay House in the 1850s, and has written an essay published on the Dictionary of Sydney website on the Hydro Majestic and Mark Foy. With this knowledge, his talk on The Hydro Majestic Story should be very interesting.

Look for the tallest trees surrounding the cottage.

The garden displays a carpet of beautiful purple Jacaranda flowers this month. Mistaken for an Australian native, it's originally from South America.

The cottage is picture perfect; surrounded by colourful Jacarandas, distinctive Australian native trees and classic 200 year old English Oaks. Make sure you take a photo during your visit.

HMAS Parramatta, Mersa Matruh, Egypt

The Royal Australian Navy received the Grimsby Class Sloop following its launching in 1939. She took part in operations against Italian Eritrea, East Africa, in 1941, then transferred to the Mediterranean station, escorting vessels carrying desperately needed supplies to Tobruk in North Africa where Australian soldiers were under siege by the German army led by Rommel. In one action, forty eight dive bombers attacked the ship and her surrounding vessels, yet she successfully defended her charges.

On November 27, 1941 a single torpedo struck amidships tearing the ship apart. One hundred and thirty-eight men, including the Commanding Officer and all nine officers, lost their lives. Only twenty-four of the crew survived.

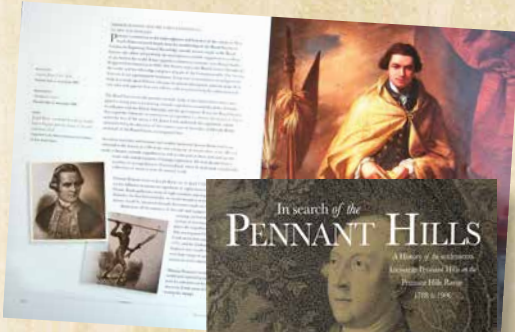
A memorial service will be held on the Sunday November 25, in the Queens Wharf Reserve, George Street, Parramatta.

This handsome 208 page all Australian book is richly illustrated with colour, monochrome pictures, special maps, and is fully indexed and referenced.



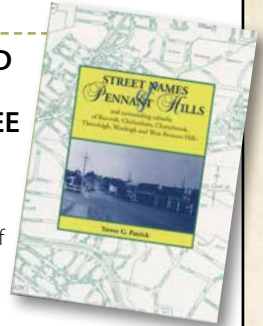
